June 24, 1717, Formation of U.G.L.E.

- Some early Masons and their Lodges were referred to as St. John Masons, St. John's Men, and St. John Lodges
- The Baptist was regarded as the patron of stonemasons in Europe during the Middle Ages



Erected to God and Dedicated to the Holy Saints John

- Since their time, there is or should be represented in every well furnished Lodge a certain point within a circle...
- This circle is supported by two perpendicular parallel lines representing Saint John the Baptist and Saint John the Evangelist...

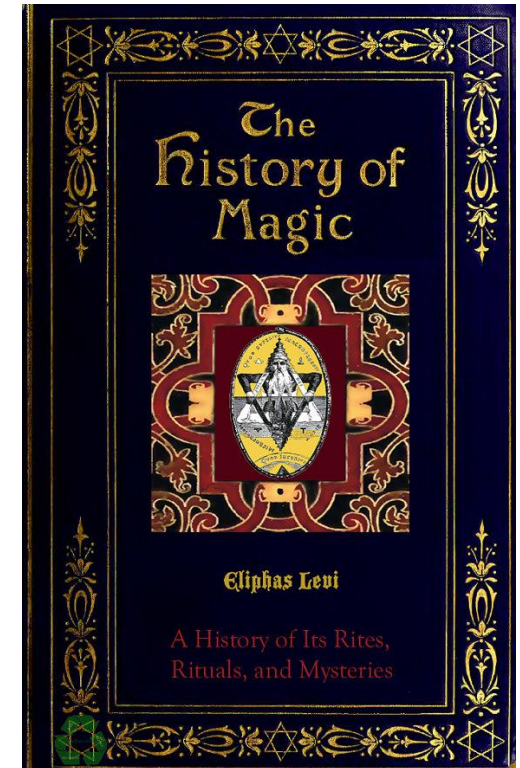
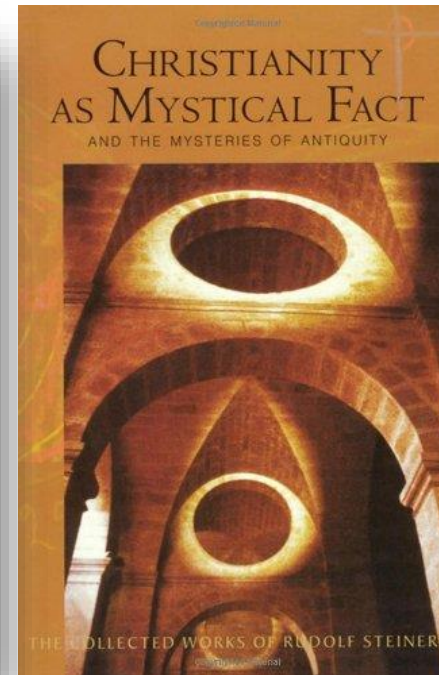
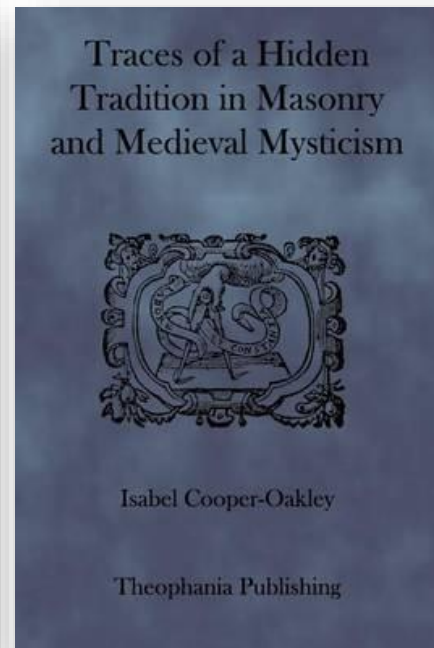
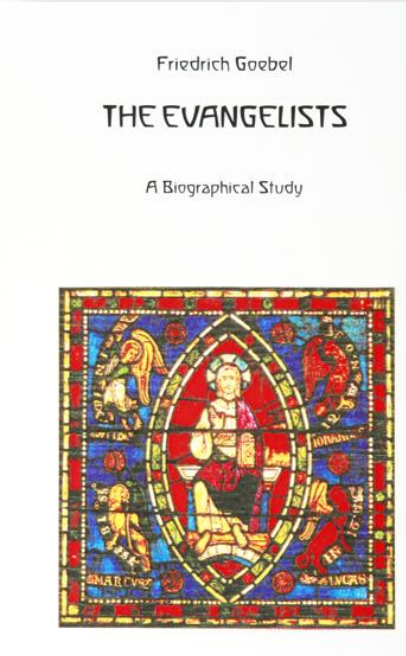
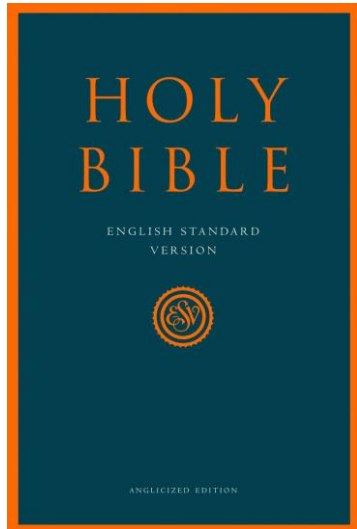
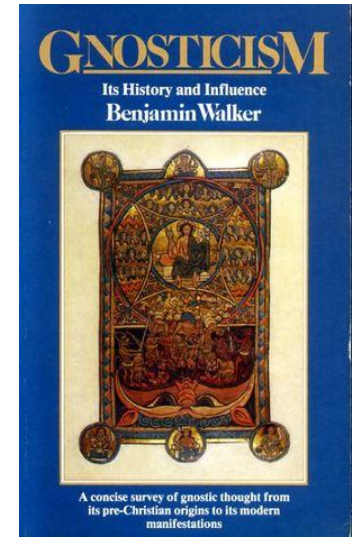
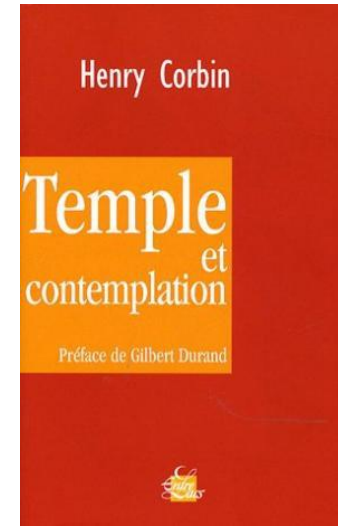
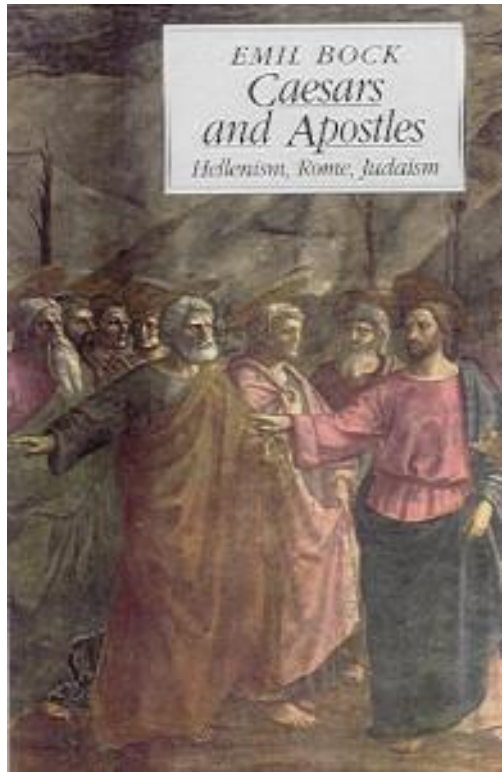

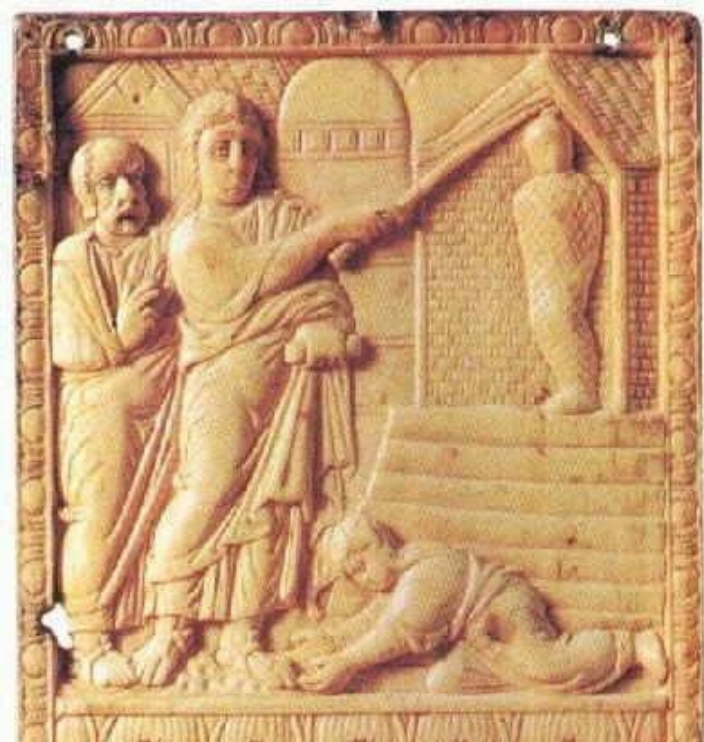






Lazarus John and the Temple Sleep

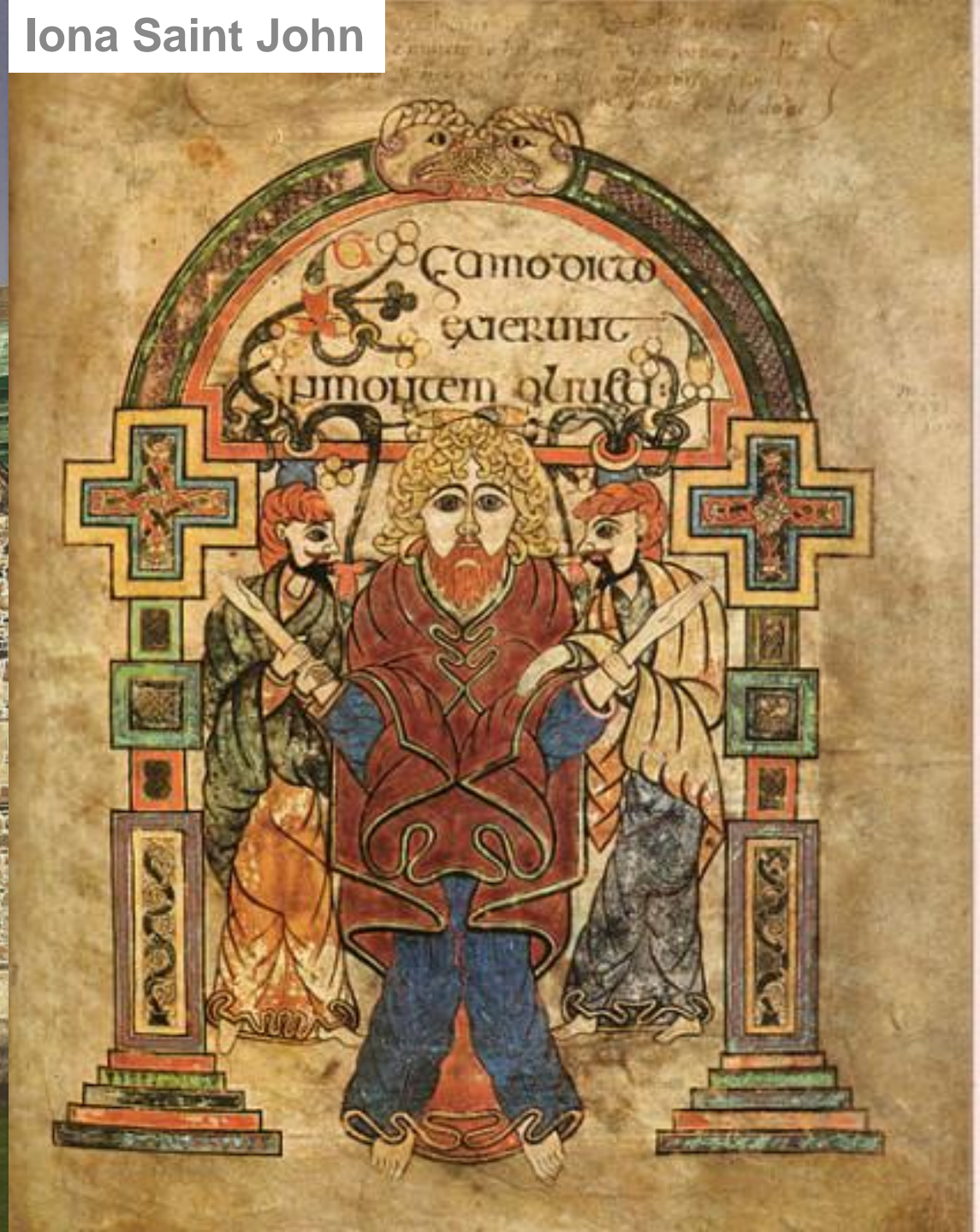
