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


































They were identified by the Greek philosopher Plato As the necessary character traits of a good man

by other ancient authors such as The Roman philosopher and statesman Stoic Cicero.






They were also defined by 4th-century theologian Ambrose as "prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance.".

#### Prudence



Is the virtue that guides us by

- setting rules
- setting measures on our actions
- directing our conduct
- being careful about your choices
- stopping and thinking before acting
- It is the strength to of restraint

in accordance with our conscience, or Self-reflection.

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## Justice

Justice is the virtue that reminds us

- to behave fairly when dealing with another person
- to ensure that each do the necessary work
- for the betterment of society.
- people are to be treated impartially
- people are to be treated fairly
- people are to be treated properly
- people are to be treated reasonably by the law.

Valor is courage or bravery, especially in battle.




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## Temperance

by the practice of calmness and self-control.



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













William Preston first introduced them into the Degree as referring to what was then, and long before had

but which are now known as the Perfect Points of Entrance






Freemasonry is defined as an organized society of men symbolically applying the principles of operative Masonry and architecture to the science and art of character building.


